

## URGENT CARE AND MEMORY CARE FACILITY, LEVITTOWN

THE CLIENT DEVELOPED A PROGRAM FOR THE DESIGN OF AN URGENT CARE CENTER, A MEMORY CARE FACILITY AND TWELVE MICRO-DWELLING UNITS (FUTURE PROJECT). THE KEY GOAL IS MAKING THE URGENT CARE EASILY VISIBLE FROM THE MAIN ROAD, THE MEMORY CARE ENTRANCE HIDDEN FROM THE DIRECT VIEW OF WANTAGH AVE. AND THE MICRO DWELLINGS TO CREATE A SMALL COMMUNITY FOR SENIORS AWAY FROM THE PARKING LOT AND THE TRAFFIC OF THE ROAD AND EXISTING STRIP MALL.

THE BUILDING WAS DESIGNED FOLLOWING THE SIZES, LAYOUT AND ASPECT RATIOS PRESENTED BY THE CLIENT. ROOM SIZES WERE ADJUSTED ACCORDINGLY WITH THE CLIENT TO MEET A 20 PERCENT REDUCTION OF THE BUDGET, SPECIFIC ROOMS ARE DESIGNED TO BE SHARED BETWEEN THE TWO FACILITIES, SUCH AS STORAGE, BREAK
